we felt as we read that first chapter of our reading how it was that Judah first, amongst those who conspired against Jerusalem to hinder that work, spoke of the impossibility of those things being performed, the Jews that had returned. Much rubbish so that we are not able to build the wall. The adversaries they shall not know neither see till we come in the midst among them and slay them.

From all places whence ye shall return unto us they will be upon you. Nehemiah felt his own weakness, realised his need of that help of almighty God to continue in that which he was persuaded was right in the sight of almighty God.

[9:36] the work is great and large. They laboured in that work.

He made provision for that watching for the enemy and instructed the people to resort unto him for he saith our God shall fight for us.

Neither know we what to do but our eyes are upon thee. But a little later those adversaries haven't spoken in scorn and realising that this did not bring about a cessation of that work but rather bound the people together in that pursuit of that desire of their heart the building of those walls of Jerusalem.

Those accusations must have sorely spitting his heart such good countenance that such things should motivate his labour they said make thyself a king in that thou hast appointed prophets to preach of thee at Jerusalem come now therefore and let us take counsel together there are no such things oh how firm was that denial friends there are the seasons when these are courageous in the work of

God and must emphatically deny that which is spoken against them thou painest these out of thine own heart they all made us afraid they sought to weaken their hands from that work he set himself to ask help of the Lord strengthen oh God my hands now again they sought by other means to cause that labour to cease he sent a so called prophet one that came supposedly with the word of the

Lord saying that many sought to slay him thus he advised that sheltering in the temple this brought forth this response from Nehemiah's heart should such a man as I flee we cannot tell what is the purpose of almighty God in laying such a word upon one's spirit this evening the Lord alone knoweth word perhaps which some may not even have realized lie within holy writ the rising up of this man of

God against that opposition should such a man as I flee does Satan tempt me to give up and call no more on Jesus name we read of those letters they passed through many hands in Judah was that reported of the good of those that opposed Nehemiah reported also those words of this man of God sent to sent letters to put me in fear we heard it said but a few days ago that the opposition made it out against our standing as gospel standard causes so increased over these last two years things that nothing like it has been known before sent letters to put me in fear shall or should such a man as I flee some may feel ready to give up ready to lay down that charge a solemn word is spoken concerning

Lot's wife who looked back oh God strengthen my hands should such a man as I flee there is opposition there ever is to the cause of Christ those foes increase and gain ground and would destroy if it were possible the faith of God's elect now see this man had a burden upon his heart such a man as

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[ 20 : 37 ] I the Lord had laid that burden there it was not that which he had gathered unto himself but rather that which the Lord had laid upon his spirit that report came concerning the desolation of Jerusalem her broken walls it stirred this man up to seek help of God should such a man as I flee should he who had been raised up of God who felt his own weakness realized his need conscience of his utter dependence upon the

Lord should he lay down those charges would there not be a falling away of those that labored where would have been that rallying voice to strengthen and support them in those days of such conflict should such a man as I flee from fields hill this dear man of God was stirred and stirred of God to renounce those accusations and to show clearly his confidence in his God in the continuance of that labor upon Jerusalem's wars should such a man as I flee.

These were very subtle moves by the adversary. Nehemiah was put into the very peril of his life.

Yet he believed in his God. Believed in his ability and willingness to save and deliver in that hour of his need.

And he would not relinquish that post. But there are the times when such a rallying is needed, such a renouncing of those devilish drakes to cause that laying down of alms.

is thy God Daniel whom thou serviced continually able to save thee from the lions.

He stood fast, stood firm for those things in which he verily believed. And the power and glory of God was seen in amongst that heathen people.

Any other like occasions there are? I think of the prophet as those of Baal came. That signal deliverance shall such a man as I flee.

remember in after that signal deliverance he fell prey to those doubts and fears fearing that his life should be taken by that wicked woman jezebel.

Such is our nature. Such is the weakness of our faith. One says our faith is feeble, we confess, we faintly trust thy word, but wilt thou pity us the less, be that far from thee, Lord?

[33:07] should such a man as I flee.

Nehemiah defuted those accusations, determined not to be caught in that snare, continued with that work, being against all that opposed him, should such a man as I flee.

One feels it in this way, those precious doctrines, God honouring, Christ exalting doctrines, the articles of our faith are assailed.

Should we lay down our arms? Should it not be with us? Oh, may we know more of that gracious zeal of the Spirit for the cause of Christ, as it might be said to stand up and be counted in these last days to show forth whose we are and whom we desire to serve.

Should such a man as I flee? Many of these things are held in derision.

[35:10] They're scorned. The low state of Zion, our churches, were a great burden to God's people.

Should such a man as I flee? The Lord will have those in the forefront of the battle.

He has said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee. my presence shall go with thee, and I will give thee rest.

All may seem impossible. Those enemies of truth ride, as it were, rough shot over the little remnant.

One says concerning prayer, the feeble soul can wield it best. Should such a man as I flee, do these few thoughts find a place in thine heart?

many are they that do oppose. Many that would see our destruction would have us destroyed, would delight in our downfall.

Amen. To whom else can we go? Thou hast the words of eternal life.
